

POLICY IS PERSONAL

Recently, policymakers in Washington, D.C., took two important actions to begin laying the groundwork for a more prosperous and fair economy. One of those steps was reaching an agreement in principle on a [Bipartisan Infrastructure Framework](#) to make investments in our nation's infrastructure. The other was the recent signing of an [Executive Order](#) by President Biden to promote competition in the economy.

After years of partisan gridlock and the inability, or unwillingness, of policymakers in D.C. to address the dangers of [monopoly power and corporate concentration](#), last and this month's actions are certainly welcomed developments. However, rather than [advancing anti-monopoly laws that fail to center the needs of people of color](#) or [keeping the IRS intentionally weak](#), Congress must do more to create the kind of economy that Black, Latinx, Asian, Indigenous, and Pacific Islander people need to thrive. Just as important, policymakers must also reject using bipartisanship as an excuse to continue the economic oppression of people of color.

Building a liberation economy and dismantling our oppression economy will require our governments to enact bold, transformative policy change. If COVID-19 and George Floyd's murder have taught us anything its that policy is personal and that policy development cannot be done in a vacuum. This is why Liberation in a Generation will continue to courageously work towards building the power of people of color in order to create a world beyond our expectations.
