


Dear [name],

BOLSTERING GRASSROOTS POWER: SUPPORTING THE LIBERATORY VISIONS OF ORGANIZERS OF COLOR

In 2021, our grassroots team grew and immediately started deepening our relationships with powerful organizations. Job one has been creating a library of offerings to support groups in visioning collective liberation, setting values, and crafting analysis to build power around liberatory policy.




- At the local level, we deepened our engagement with organizations in Florida, Ohio, and California, working with forward-thinking organizations, including Communities for a New California, Live Free California, Ohio Transformation Fund, Ohio Voice, and the Florida Housing Justice Alliance.
- At the national level, we are supporting the work of major organizing networks, such as <u>Community Change, the Center for Popular Democracy</u>, and <u>People's Action</u>.

PLANTING OUR POLICY FLAG: DEMANDING ACTION ROOTED IN ECONOMIC **LIBERATION**

LibGen grew our policy staff to ensure that we are laying a groundwork of policy ideas to be shaped, critiqued, and even scrapped by the groups we support building power on the ground. These publications help us have those conversations:

- In the spring, we released Anti-Monopoly Activism: Reclaiming Power Through Racial Justice. This report serves as the foundation for future work to co-create a policy agenda to curb corporate power for the benefit of people of color. To roll out the report, we organized three convenings, including a panel with Federal Trade Commission (FTC) Acting Chair Rebecca Slaughter. The report was later mentioned on various platforms, including Jonathan Van Ness's podcast, Getting Curious.
 - o In November, we continued this work by convening a growing community of researchers, policy advocates, and grassroots organizers to develop an antiracist corporate power platform to guide future activism. This committee will continue to meet in 2022 to publish, disseminate, and amplify a research agenda, policy platform, and ecosystem map to guide participants' ongoing advocacy as we push ahead on the path to a Liberation Economy.



- In July 2021, we published our <u>first-ever federal policy brief</u> on guaranteed income. Guaranteed income is the first of a slate of economic policy guarantees that will serve as the foundation for our Liberation Economy Policy Platform. In November, we also released our policy brief on <u>guaranteed housing</u>. These are just two of the guarantees from our slate that we believe, when enacted, are crucial for economic liberation. • Our team supported Jeremie in testifying before the House Financial Services Committee
- about the biases within the credit reporting system and the need for reform. We also submitted congressional statements for the record: "Wall Street vs. Workers: How the Financial System Hurts Workers and Widens the Racial Wealth Gap" and "Justice for All: Achieving Racial Equity Through Fair Access to Housing and Financial Services."


